

# Pharmacy Residency

## About the Program

DHR Health in cooperation with Texas A&M Irma Lerma Rangel School of Pharmacy offers a 12 month post graduate curriculum that provides training opportunities in acute care, ambulatory care, drug information, drug use policy development, clinical services, leadership, research, and teaching. The residency is designed to offer an individualized training plan for each resident based on their interests, goals and past experiences. Residents will be required to complete core rotations in order to build a strong knowledge base and have the opportunity to select elective rotations in different fields of interest.

The program is designed to develop the following competencies:

- Advancing Practice and Improving Patient Care
- Leadership and Management
- Teaching, Education, and Dissemination of Knowledge

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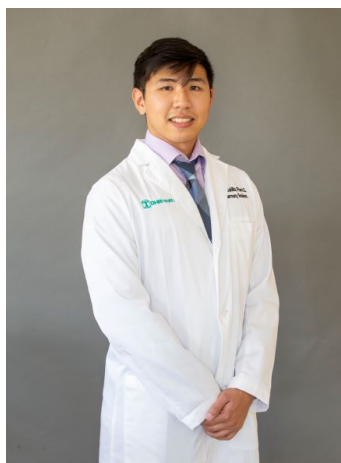
